In line with the DfE and schools across Suffolk, all holidays will be unauthorised and likely to entail a fine. Due to Covid many schools have not used the fining process, however from September our Absence Policy will be followed including the unauthorisation of holidays and the relevant fine.

Communication

Families are welcome to visit the school to discuss their child's progress, ask questions, and gain support or to have the opportunity to talk about their child/home issues with their child's class teacher first, then Mrs Lawrence for SEND and Ms Rowe for Pastoral. In every first instance the class teacher should be the first point of contact. Outside of teaching their designated class all staff have additional duties which they perform either before school, during break/lunch or after school. These duties will include care of children, organisation of extra-curricular activities or whole-school coordination of a curriculum subject. We aim to be able to facilitate requests for an immediate meeting, however for the reasons stated above, when this is not possible, staff may not be able to facilitate an immediate, unscheduled appointment but will aim to do so within 5 school days. Arranging a mutually convenient appointment allows the school time to organise cover (if needed) to make staff available to speak to the families and to gather any necessary information prior to the meeting. This process will make the meeting much more conducive.

Messages at the gate

Members of staff will be on the school gate from 8.45am where messages for class teachers or other school adults can be passed on. **Teachers at this time are normally working with the children already in the classroom.**

Electronic Information

The school subscribes to ParentMail, Tapestry and Seesaw allowing us to send letters and messages to families. Not only is this more environmentally friendly as it decreases paper usage, it also reduces photocopying and other costs in the school. We urge families to provide us with a valid email address if you are not already receiving emails/messages from ParentMail, Tapestry (Reception only) or Seesaw.

Families are encouraged to use our school e-mail as a means of providing a quick, effective way of communicating information about their child or to arrange a meeting with their teacher.

Families are reminded that teachers have little to no time during their teaching day to check Seesaw or Tapestry and therefore requests which require immediate or quick action should not be sent via this communication method. For example, messaging your child's teacher to inform them you will be collecting them for an appointment or to change pick-up arrangements is not appropriate due to the high likelihood that the message will not be read in time. It is important that families telephone the school office with this information.

All communications requiring an answer should be responded to within 3 school days. Staff are not expected to, and are discouraged from, checking and responding to messages outside of their working day. However, staff are encouraged to work flexibly and respond to messages in a way that suits them to balance their working hours. Staff do not expect families to read, respond or action messages outside hours that suit them either.

Emails, Tapestry and Seesaw does not replace face to face meetings where some discussion is required. All staff should seek face to face communications, when electronic communication is not the most effective form of communication. Staff and families are discouraged from entering into in-depth discussions about a child's progress or well-being via our electronic communication systems.

Telephone calls

Inbound: All telephone calls will be answered by staff in the main office. It is our policy that office staff do not interrupt teaching for staff to answer a telephone call unless it is an emergency. Messages are taken and forwarded to the relevant person. If the call requires a response from a member of staff, we aim to do this within 3 working days.

Outbound: Telephone calls will be made where immediate contact with a family member is required i.e. for injuries or accidents. A member of staff will call the first named emergency contact as listed. Where no contact is made, a call will then be made to the second named contact and so forth. In the event that no live contact can be made, the member of staff will either leave an answer phone message or ensure that repeat calls continue to be made to the contact numbers, where possible.

Huggy Wuggy?

Poppy Playtime is a PC horror games that involves a mystery in an abandoned toy factory. As the player, you roam around the factory and collect VHS tapes to solve the mystery. You must solve puzzles while trying to survive the "vengeful toys" left behind. "Huggy Wuggy" is one of the game's most popular and visually disturbing characters- characters are giant, horrifying blue creatures with bulging eyes, wide red lips, and long limbs who appear in the dark and try to catch you. If you get caught, Huggy Wuggy bears his wide and sinister grin and eats you.

Although Poppy Playtime was released over a year ago, there has been a recent surge in the creation of Huggy Wuggy- related content on line (which can be very graphic), alongside reported playground style play which in some cases has really scared some of our younger children.

With the popularity of this game toy makers have jumped on the band waggon and made Huggy Wuggy toys, we kindly ask that these toys are not brought into school.

Parking

We kindly ask that those who drive to and from school (especially as number of cars will increase as the winter months hit) park in a place that will not cause an obstruction or danger to our school community. The office is receiving daily reports of cars being parked up on the double lines outside the school. As parking and roads are governed by the Highways Agency and the Police the school has little power other than to advise parents and visitors to the school that parking on double yellow lines is illegal and if caught by the police or traffic warden could result in a fine and penalty points.

We also ask that the layby is only used for immediate drop off only, where parents need to get out of their cars to enter into the playground for example, they do not park in the layby. We have a selection of blue badge holders who also need direct access via the layby into the school grounds.




The theme this year is Reach Out. It is organised by the Anti-Bullying Alliance and they have set the following key aim:

Together, let's be the change we want to see. Reflect on our own behaviour, set positive examples and create kinder communities.


