The Zero Game

Place numbers face down then pick a number and turn it over.

Whatever the number clap that many times. When the zero card is turned remain still and silent.

To spice this game up a bit, instead of clapping...

They can pat their knees, jump up and down, stomp, etc..

Provide equipment for throwing and rolling games such as skittles, beanbags and buckets. Encourage the children to notice when they knock over 0 skittles or when 0 beanbags land inside the bucket. How could they record their score?

Stair Stepping

Here is another game to help children understand number 0. The children must start at the top of the stairs.

When you call out "one," the child must jump one step down. If you call out "zero," the child must stay where they are. If they step down when you call out 0, they are out of the game. In this manner children must try to stay in the game until they reach the bottom of the stairs.

Extend by adding (jumping up), subtracting (jumping down) numbers from 0 to 10.
